SUNY Cortland Athletes Honored at 2005 Athletic Awards Banquet

The 2005 SUNY Cortland C-Club Athletic Awards Banquet, held in early May in the College's Corey Union, honored the top student-athletes from among the 600-plus who competed on Cortland's 25 men's and women's intercollegiate teams during the past academic year.

The SUNY Cortland C-Club Male Senior Athlete of the Year Award was presented to baseball pitcher **Matt Miller (Harrison)** and the C-Club Female Senior Athlete of the Year was given to volleyball setter **Jamie McMullen (Castile/Letchworth)**. The awards were sponsored by the C-Club and were voted upon by Cortland athletic administrators.

Miller earned All-America honors in 2005 as he helped the Red Dragon baseball team finish second nationally in Division III. He completed his collegiate career as Cortland's leader with 27 wins and 242 strikeouts. McMullen was an All-American in both her junior and senior seasons. She finished second at Cortland in career assists (4,251) and seventh in career attack percentage.

Other finalists for Male Senior Athlete of the Year were football running back **Steve Davis (Central Islip)**, wrestler **Brent Rider (Tioga Center/Tioga)** and men's lacrosse attackman **Adam Hughes (North Syracuse/Cicero-North Syracuse)**. Other finalists for Female Senior Athlete of the Year were field hockey forward **Becky Osier (Morrisville/Morrisville-Eaton)**, gymnast **Colleen Shanahan (Williamsville/Williamsville East)** and women's soccer forward **Angela Bruno (Syracuse/West Genesee)**.

The Robert J. Weber Award and the Whitney T. Corey '43 Award were presented to the senior male and female student-athletes, respectively, with the highest cumulative grade point averages. Men's ice hockey forward **Joe Alfieri (Syracuse/West Genesee)**, a business economics major with a 3.89 GPA through the end of the 2004 fall semester, won the Weber Award. Women's lacrosse attacker **Lauren Frisch (Nanuet)**, a special and childhood education major with a 4.0 GPA entering the spring semester, won the Corey Award.

Robert "Doc" Weber was Cortland's director of athletics for 12 years and the Chairman of the Men's Physical Education department for 15 years. He worked at Cortland from 1952-85 and passed away in 2000. Whitney T. "Pete" Corey coached men's basketball at Cortland in the 1950's and early 1960's and also served as the school's vice president for academic affairs. The gymnasium in Cortland's Park Center bears his name.

Women's track and field athlete **Rachel Glod (Waterville)** received the M. Louise Moseley Award, which is for a senior female athlete who has demonstrated both strong leadership skills and athletic achievement. Glod set the school record in the hammer throw this past season and was an active participant with Cortland's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC).

Moseley was Cortland's Director of Women's Athletics from 1966-78. A pioneer for women's athletics, Moseley played an integral role in the start of women's intercollegiate athletics at Cortland in the late 1960's.

Baseball pitcher **Mike Burnett (Westfield)** received the Carl "Chugger" Davis Award, given to a senior male athlete for strong leadership skills and athletic achievement. Burnett was an all-region selection in both his junior and senior seasons and earned national Academic All-America honors this past spring. He finished the season with a 9-2 record, including a victory at the Division III World Series. Davis was Cortland's head football coach from 1932 to 1962 and also coached baseball, basketball and golf.

Anderson Young, a professor in Cortland's Recreation and Leisure Studies department, was chosen as the Fraser Stokes Award winner for his dedication and service to Cortland athletics. Young has been a long-time supporter of the Red Dragon athletic teams and served as the academic advisor to the women's basketball team this past season. The ninth annual "Coach of the Year" Award was presented to softball coach **Julie Lenhart**. Lenhart's squad finished the season with a 31-11 record, won a league title and participated in the NCAA Division III playoffs. She guided the Red Dragons to NCAA Division III World Series appearances in 2003 and 2004.

The Judson and Elise Taylor Team GPA Awards, named after the former SUNY Cortland president and his wife, were presented to the men's and women's athletic teams with the highest cumulative grade point averages. The men's soccer team (3.16 GPA) claimed the men's award. The women's cross country team (3.51 GPA) repeated as the women's winner. The award was first given in 2003.

Each year, the Cortland head coaches select a **Red Letter Award** winner in their respective sports. The Red Letter may be given for outstanding athletic skills, team leadership, personal development as a player, or for any combination of reasons. The 2004-05 Red Letter Award winners, by sport, are as follows:
