

Many communities in southern New York and northern Pennsylvania were devastated by flooding in late June 2006. In places the floods crested more than four feet above the previous record; 10 people died (3 in NY) and damages ran into hundreds of millions of dollars. These floods followed similarly severe flooding in 2005, which included a state of emergency in Cortland County.
